Guest Speaker:

Dr. Taylor Francher, from Paws Health Partners, she works out of Highlands Animal Care at 1651 W. Horizon Ridge Pkwy.

They have a mobile vet and can also to Telemedicine.

She talked about how important it is to have your pet's teeth checked and cleaned when needed. You can brush your dog's teeth at home, using a soft bristle toothbrush with some dog-approved toothpaste. Start by brushing one tooth a day, then progress to two a day, and so forth, to get your dog comfortable with it. The Website, "Veterinary Oral Health Council" has a list of recommend products to help with taking care of your pets dental health. You will see VOHC on the label of a recommended product. She also suggested having your pet's lab work done every year, or twice a year for an older pet. The results of the testing could show if there are any problems, and get them treated right away.
